

# **LOWVILLE GOLF CLUB POLICES**

Enjoy your round at Lowville GC even more. Get to know our course policies for all golfers, including bookings and cancellations, our dress code, course etiquette, our zero-tolerance alcohol policy, and our commitment to accessibility.

## **BOOKING A TEE TIME**

Bookings may be made up to 30 days in advance at [lowvillegolf.com](http://lowvillegolf.com) Tee times must be booked online with a valid credit card. Credit cards are not charged at the time of booking. Lowville GC may move Singles & Twosomes too a nearby tee time to complete foursomes.

## **CANCELLATIONS**

Cancellations are allowed up to 48 hours before your tee time. No-Shows or Short-Shows (i.e. less than the number of golfers booked) will be charged the FULL RATE with the credit card used at the time of booking. In the event of unfavourable weather, please call prior to your tee time as there maybe still be fair weather in our local area and play will continue as normal. In the event of severe weather or the course is considered unplayable, a call/email will be sent and all cancellation fees will be waived.

## **ALCOHOL**

Lowville GC has a zero-tolerance alcohol policy. For the safety of our guests and staff, bringing your own alcohol is not permitted anywhere on the property including the parking lot. Anyone caught with their own alcohol will have the entire group fees forfeited and all will be asked to leave the property immediately. Lowville GC reserves the right to inspect all coolers and bags on Lowville GC property. As a licensed facility issued by the AGCO, all alcohol must be purchased from Lowville GC.

Lowville GC has the right to refuse service to serve responsibly and ensure the safety of all our customers and employees.

# CANNABIS POLICY

Smoking or consuming marijuana in any form is prohibited at Lowville GC. Exceptions may be made to this policy where an individual has a medical certificate indicating that the use of marijuana has been approved by a healthcare professional. In such cases, Club management must be notified and individual accommodations discussed in advance of any such use on Lowville property.

## DRESS CODE

Lowville Golf Club requests that sensible and appropriate golf attire be always worn on the golf course. Lowville does not allow any footwear that is deemed detrimental to the golf course.

### Examples of Appropriate Golf Attire:

Collared Shirts  
Mock Necks, Blade Collar Shirts  
Tailored Pants  
Chinos, Khaki Pants  
Golf or Khaki Shorts  
Skorts (Women)  
Sleeveless Golf Shirts (Women Only)  
Golf Shoes (soft spikes only)  
Running Shoes

### Examples of Unacceptable Attire:

Denim Jeans  
Sweatpants  
Athletic/Basketball Shorts  
Sports Jerseys  
Graphic T-Shirts  
Tank Tops/Tube Tops  
Boots, Sandals, High Heels, Metal Spikes

## **SPECTATORS/CADIES**

Non-golfing guests are not permitted to walk or ride along with playing guests while on the golf course. This includes non-golfing spouses, children, and pets.

## **MUSIC**

Music is permitted on the course at a reasonable volume that does not disturb other golfers. Specifically, music coming from a cart or bag/pull cart should only be heard by the group listening when they are in close proximity. If the music exceeds this volume our staff will ask that it be turned down or off.

## **RENTAL CLUBS**

We require that each player on the course have their own set of golf clubs. For those that require rental clubs we offer them in the Pro Shop for a fee.

## **COURSE ETIQUETTE**

Please use this information as a reference and see the Golf Shop staff if you have any questions.

- Always replace your divots.
- Keep pace with the group ahead of you during your round.
- Be quiet when golfers are preparing to hit their shot.
- Always rake bunkers after use.
- Play `Ready Golf' but always be aware of fellow golfers' position around you.
- Respect on course signage and directions from Starters and Play Coordinators.
- Physical and/or Verbal abuse towards Lowville GC Staff and other Patrons WILL NOT BE TOLERATED, those found in violation of these terms will be asked to leave the premises.
